#### HOUSING SUMMIT

Deputy Warden Mustard provided the following resolution –

WHEREAS our Council have had presentations over the years by Halifax Biomedical, Shean Housing Co-op, Cabot Links Golf Resort and CBRHA around the need for housing in many forms, from rentals, to affordable ownership for young families and professionals to quality assisted living units to offset the pressure on the health care system.

WHEREAS we are now embarking on a tourism strategy and business readiness strategy across the county where there are many different factors in and across each district that need to be taken into account in order to prioritize what the opportunities are when it comes to developing housing.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Municipality of the County of Inverness help to host and organize a housing summit for the county in the next few months, where we can bring together the public sector representatives (Community Services), interested organizations (Shean Housing Co-op) and private sector businesses to help form a plan to make sure we are open and ready for business when it comes to high quality housing.
