- This is a provincial program offered through Communities, Culture and Heritage.
- The program has an annual intake that closed on February 4th, 2020.
- The program assists community groups, municipalities and other non-profit organizations to develop facilities in order to increase public participation in sport and physical recreation.
- Facilities may include:
- Recreation centres and halls, pools, arenas, athletic field, parks and playgrounds and trails.
- Enhanced schools for community use.
- Other facilities that promote sport and physical recreation.

Projects approved for funding are eligible to receive up to one-third of the total capital cost of the project to a maximum of \$150,000.


