# Year 1: 2020 Expand the Sailing Club

- Upgrade and rebrand its products and services.
- Transition to Sail Mabou-Outdoor Center
- A more inclusive hub for sailing and outdoor recreation.
- A major investment to the long-term sustainability of outdoor active living recreation.
- Upgrade existing infrastructure and purchase additional boats and equipment.



# Year 1: 2020 Expand the Sailing Club

Expenditures for the new project will include the following items:

- Install Utilities: water, power, and sewer
- Purchase additional boats/equipment

Total cost of the revised project is \$60,000.00

We will be asking the Municipality to contribute 1/3 of the cost of these expenditures which amounts to \$20,000.00



The Outdoor Centre is directly associated with the promotion, management, and sustainability of recreational products and services for Inverness county residents, as well as visitors from abroad.



Recreation plays an important role in the development of healthy communities.
