# PRESENTATION: Dernie Gills: 2020 Municipal Returning Officer

Dernie Gillis the Returning Officer for the 2020 Municipal Elections updated Council. Mr. Gillis introduced Jaime Beaton, Revisions Assistant. Highlights included:

- The Preliminary list of electors: This will be available after July 15<sup>th</sup>.
- Voting Venues: There will be elections in six districts. October 16<sup>th</sup> will be preparation day.

- Workers: One hundred four workers are required, plus twelve advance poll workers. Additional Cleaning staff for venues may be needed.
- Training for workers: This will take place in June.
- Social distancing rules, if still in place in October will have to be strictly followed.
- Nominations will be held by appointment from September 1<sup>st</sup> September 4<sup>th</sup> 2020.

Comments were provided by Council. Topics covered include the campaigning process during a pandemic, the possible of town halls, polling logistics on an election day, venue sanitation, and rates of pay for Municipal Elections Employees. At this time, some uncertainty remains regarding the rules and logistics around Municipal Elections and the campaigning process.

**UPDATE: OLD PORT HOOD GOVERNMENT WHARF** 

Melanie Beaton provided an update to Council. This wharf structure is in an advanced state of deterioration and the recent conditional assessment conducted by Dillon Engineering provided the scope of work necessary to undertake a demolition and stabilization project. The demolition and removal of the deteriorated outer "T" shaped wharf and the stabilization of the breakwater at the former Port Hood Public Wharf site will ensure the integrity of the beach as it is influenced by the existing wharf structure, and will protect public health and safety. Necessary permits in compliance with the federal Navigable Waters Act and the Federal Fisheries Act are being advanced at this time. The procurement document will hopefully be finalized and posted in the coming weeks.

### 2020-2021 OPERATIONS BUDGET

Keith MacDonald highlighted the Operational priorities of the 2020-2021 budget for Council. Tanya Tibbo provided a detailed breakdown of anticipated revenues and expenditures for the 2020-2021 fiscal year in a balanced budget. Tax rates and area rates will remain the same. Improved service delivery, and continued support for Council and staff, as well as residents, communities, businesses, and non profit organizations are the priorities going forward.

MOTION: RESOLVED that pursuant to Section 72 of the Municipal Government Act, of the Province of Nova Scotia, the Municipal Council of the Municipality of the County of Inverness hereby authorize the levying and collection of a commercial property rate of \$1.91 and a residential and resource rate of \$1.05 per one hundred dollars of the assessed value of property and on the assessment roll which the said Council deems sufficient to raise the sum required to defray the expenditures of the said Municipality which amount to \$17,249,500.
