BUSINESS ARISING

Councillor Mustard recently spoke with MLA Allan MacMaster, and impressed upon him the importance of working collaboratively and the need for cooperation. The MLA recently agreed to meet with Council after the October 17th Municipal election.

Consensus that a letter be written to MLA MacMaster to invite him to a meeting of Council prior to the Municipal election possibly on October 14th or 15th.

Communication has been made with the Department of Transportation and Infrastructure Renewal regarding Council's request for a crosswalk to be placed in Cheticamp at the intersection of Barren Road and the Cabot Trail Highway.

MILFORD ROAD, WHYCOCOMAGH

Milford Road, Whycocomagh was approved for J Class Road Paving by the Province of Nova Scotia. This road is broken down into three components by Transportation and Infrastructure Renewal: a J, I, and K Class. The J Class portion is .49 km. Transportation and Infrastructure Renewal is looking at options to extend paving past the J Class portion. A shorter portion of Milford Road extends on the South side of the Trans Canada Highway. Councillor MacLennan and CAO MacDonald will communicate with Transportation and Infrastructure Renewal regarding a possible exchange of future paving between the Southern portion of Milford Road with the Northern portion of Milford Road.

UPDATE: HEAVY GARBAGE Pick-Up; Keith MacDonald

The 2020 Fall Heavy Garbage pick-up schedule was presented to Council. It will occur over the course of three weeks, October $5^{th} - 23^{rd}$. The budget for the project is \$45,000.00. It is difficult to predict the volume that will be collected, due to the lack of a Spring 2020 pickup. Volume of garbage collected will be monitored weekly.

UPDATE: CELL SERVICE; Keith MacDonald

The Municipality received three submissions to the Cell Service Request for Proposals. The submissions from these potential providers have been reviewed and scored. A finalized potential plan should be ready for the next Committee of the Whole.

UPDATE: ACCESSIBILITY; Charlotte MacDonald

Under Nova Scotia's Accessibility Act prescribed public sector bodies are required to develop an Accessibility Plan which must include the following:

- How you will identify, remove and prevent barriers in policies, programs, practices, and services and achievements to date
- Processes in place to access the effect of your policies, programs, practices, and services on accessibility

Accessibility standards will apply to the Government of Nova Scotia, public sector bodies prescribed under the Act (such as post-secondary education institutions, municipalities) and other entities, such as private businesses.
