

## Internet Suggestions

- 1. Get fibre maps and check for communities and roads not covered.
- 2. Ask DevNS to cover the gaps. They have money.
- 3. If they won't fund, then apply to Universal Broadband Fund (due Jan 15).
- 4. Accelerate the project. Ask DevNS and UBF for money to do this as well.
- 5. Monitor Pictou, HRM, and Inverness County to ensure same price + same service offering.
- 6. Ensure Keith's meeting with DevNS and Bell:
  - covers any cell, internet, service, fibre, or tower issue.
  - happens regularly
  - is attended by county project owner, Melanie?, and consultant. Keith attends for major issues.
  - updates public

# Cell Suggestions

Important Note: Internet and cell service use mostly the same fibre network.

- 1. Bell will only build towers where return on investment is 3-5 years. Towers will connect to new and old fibre.
- 2. Coverage gaps solution: Build where Bell isn't, to compliment Bell. Need Bell's tower placement map.
- Revenue for the county solution: Pick best locations and compete with Bell.
- 4. Can do some of both 2 and 3
- Lease cell radio tower placement to Bell and competitors.
- 4. Third-party can manage towers and leasing.
- 5. County has tender on wireless.

# StarLink: A Second Option

- StarLink: Rural high-speed, satellite internet probably in 2021.
- Allan MacMaster and Keith are talking to them.
- Possibility: Use UBF funds to buy satellite dishes for people in 2021.
- Why: Service in 2021 and Bell gets a real competitor.
- If county involved, almost no cost.




