- Opened in 2009 as part of economic diversification after closure of cod fishery
- Unique attraction in the Acadian region of Inverness County
- In 2014, LeMoyne Development wanted another organization to take over management
- Societe Mi-Careme formed and has managed the Centre since
- Activities almost year-round until Covid-19
- Have accessed government programs offered during the pandemic to assure operation and survival
- Centre is 12 years old and could use upgrades

Management

- Management position difficult to fill with competent individual
- Needs a marketing and revenue generation strategy in place (boutique, cuisine, interpretation, studio)

Signage

- Located off the highway
- Need high visibility signage to draw visitors

Monitors

- Outdated and some are not functional
- As part of the experience of Mi-Careme, should be replaced before start of 2022 season

Funding Requested

Monitors - \$10,000 to help us acquire state-of-the-art equipment

Signage - \$10,000 for strategically placed, highly visible signage to draw visitors to our location

Meals on Wheels

- Due to Covid-19, Meals on Wheels was shut down at Foyer Pere Fiset
- Kinsmen, Community Matters and others involved are concerned about food security for seniors and vulnerable community members
- Mi-Careme Centre approached to see whether Meals on Wheels could operate out of our certified kitchen
- Program has been running out of the Centre since June 2020, in emergency style operation
- With a few additions, the kitchen infrastructure could well serve both our cuisine needs as well as Meals on Wheels needs
- I will now let Chester Muise of the Kinsmen Club of Cheticamp explain the needs and aspirations of the Meals on Wheels Program for the greater Cheticamp area
