4. CAPITAL BUDGET

Municipal staff presented Council with an update on the proposed Route 19 Sanitary Sewer and Water Main Replacement project. A recent assessment of the existing Municipal water and waste water infrastructure categorized the Inverness infrastructure with a very poor rating. A tender for completion of this project closed on July 29th, 2021. Municipal staff provided Council with a breakdown of costs, project timelines and recommendations.

<u>WHEREAS</u> Section 66 of the Municipal Government Act provides that the Council of the <u>Municipality of the County of Inverness</u>, subject to the approval of the Minister of Municipal Affairs, may borrow to expend funds for a capital purpose as authorized by statute;

<u>WHEREAS</u> the Council of the <u>Municipality of the County of Inverness</u> has adopted a capital budget for this fiscal year as required by Section 65 of the Municipal Government Act and are so authorized to expend funds for a capital purpose as identified in their capital budget; and

WHEREAS the Council of the Municipality of the County of Inverness has determined to borrow the aggregate principal amount of three million, five hundred sixty-three thousand, three hundred dollars (\$3,563,300.00) for the purposes of Route 19 – Sanitary Sewer & Water Main Replacement

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED

<u>THAT</u> under the authority of Section 66 of the Municipal Government Act, the Council of the <u>Municipality of the County of Inverness</u> borrow a sum or sums not exceeding <u>three million</u>, <u>five-hundred</u>, <u>sixty-three thousand</u>, <u>three hundred dollars</u> (\$3,563,300.00) for the purpose set out above, subject to the approval of the Minister of Municipal Affairs;

<u>THAT</u> the sum be borrowed by the issue and sale of debentures of the Council of the <u>Municipality of the County of Inverness</u> to such an amount as the Council deems necessary;

<u>THAT</u> the issue of debentures be postponed pursuant to Section 92 of the Municipal Government Act and that the Council borrow from time to time a sum or sums not exceeding three million, five-hundred, sixty-three thousand, three hundred dollars (\$3,563,300.00) in total from any chartered bank or trust company doing business in Nova Scotia;

<u>THAT</u> the sum be borrowed for a period not exceeding Twelve (12) Months from the date of the approval of the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing of this resolution;

THAT the interest payable on the borrowing be paid at a rate to be agreed upon; and

<u>THAT</u> the amount borrowed be repaid from the proceeds of the debentures when sold.

8. RECOGNITION OF EMANCIPATION DAY – AUGUST 1, 2021

The following declaration was read by the Warden:

For the first time, the Province of Nova Scotia officially observed Emancipation Day on August 1st, marking the anniversary of 1834 when the British Empire outlawed slavery.

Indigenous people and people of African descent were enslaved here in Nova Scotia and in Cape Breton, some died in terrible conditions during Transatlantic voyages, and all were subjected to dehumanizing abuse that has left a legacy of systemic inequality and oppression.

As we work to dismantle these systems of inequality, I would like to take this moment to remember and honour the victims of slavery, as well as celebrate those who fought to abolish slavery and those who work to end racism and discrimination still today.
