## 7. <u>ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATIONS</u>

The Municipal Special Projects Team is building out a project for EV charging stations. There exists a budget for this item in this year's Capital budget. A Federal program that is administered by Natural Resources Canada is about to launch. Applications will be submitted after February 7<sup>th</sup>, 2022 and are due by March 2022. Successful applicants must complete their projects by July 2022.

## 8. **BOUNDARY REVIEW**

The Municipal Government Act requires that Municipalities apply to the Nova Scotia Utility and Review Board in 2022 to confirm or to alter the number and boundaries of polling districts and the number of councillors. All councils must conduct a study into the number of councillors and into the reasonableness and fairness of the number and boundaries of polling districts before making the application to the Board.

#### 9. RESOLUTION FOR PRE-APPROVAL OF DEBENTURE ISSUANCE SUBJECT TO INTEREST RATE

#### a) J CLASS ROADS

MOTION:

<u>WHEREAS</u> clause 66 (1) of the Municipal Government Act (the "Act") provides that a municipality may borrow to carry out an authority to expend funds for capital purposes conferred by the Act or another Act of the Legislature;

<u>AND WHEREAS</u> clause 91(1)(a) of the Act provides that where a municipality is authorized to borrow money, subject to the approval of the Minister of Municipal Affairs (the "Minister"), that the sum shall be borrowed by the issue and sale of debentures, in one sum or by installments, as determined by the council;

<u>AND WHEREAS</u> clause 91(1)(b) of the Municipal Government Act authorizes the council to determine the amount and term of, and the rate of interest, on each debenture, when the interest on a debenture is to be paid, and where the principal and interest on a debenture are to be paid;

<u>AND WHEREAS</u> clause 91(2) of the Municipal Government Act states, that in accordance with the Municipal Finance Corporation Act, the mayor or warden and clerk or the person designated by the council, by policy, shall sell and deliver the debentures on behalf of the municipality at the price, in the sums and in the manner deemed proper;

<u>AND WHEREAS</u> the resolution of council to borrow for **J Class Roads** was approved by the municipal council on May 6th, 2021.

#### **BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED**

<u>THAT</u> under the authority of Section 91 of the Municipal Government Act, the Municipality of the County of Inverness borrow by the issue and sale of debentures a sum or sums not exceeding \$1,055,200.00, for a period not to exceed 10 years, subject to the approval of the Minister;

<u>THAT</u> the sum be borrowed by the issue and sale of debentures of the Municipality of the County of Inverness in the amount that the mayor or warden and clerk or the person designated by the council deems proper, provided the average interest rate of the debenture does not exceed the rate of 5.5%;

<u>THAT</u> the debenture be arranged with the Nova Scotia Municipal Finance Corporation with interest to be paid semi-annually and principal payments made annually;

<u>THAT</u> this resolution remains in force for a period not exceeding twelve months from the passing of this resolution.

<u>AND WHEREAS</u> clause 91(1)(b) of the Municipal Government Act authorizes the council to determine the amount and term of, and the rate of interest, on each debenture, when the interest on a debenture is to be paid, and where the principal and interest on a debenture are to be paid;

<u>AND WHEREAS</u> clause 91(2) of the Municipal Government Act states, that in accordance with the Municipal Finance Corporation Act, the mayor or warden and clerk or the person designated by the council, by policy, shall sell and deliver the debentures on behalf of the municipality at the price, in the sums and in the manner deemed proper;

<u>AND WHEREAS</u> the resolution of council to borrow for **Route 19 Sanitary Sewer & Water** was approved by the municipal council on August 5th, 2021.

## **BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED**

<u>THAT</u> under the authority of Section 91 of the Municipal Government Act, the Municipality of the County of Inverness borrow by the issue and sale of debentures a sum or sums not exceeding \$3,563,300.00, for a period not to exceed 25 years, subject to the approval of the Minister;

<u>THAT</u> the sum be borrowed by the issue and sale of debentures of the Municipality of the County of Inverness in the amount that the mayor or warden and clerk or the person designated by the council deems proper, provided the average interest rate of the debenture does not exceed the rate of 5.5%;

<u>THAT</u> the debenture be arranged with the Nova Scotia Municipal Finance Corporation with interest to be paid semi-annually and principal payments made annually;

<u>THAT</u> this resolution remains in force for a period not exceeding twelve months from the passing of this resolution.
