4. <u>PRESENTATION: PROPERTY VALUATION SERVICES CORPORATION; Paul Beazley and Adam Hanna</u>

Property Valuation Services Corporation (PVSC) was created under the Property Valuation Service Corporation Act and is responsible for assessing all property in Nova Scotia as per the Nova Scotia Assessment Act. The organization is Municipally funded, governed by a Board of Directors and employs approximately 130 staff. They deliver an assessment role to all 49 municipalities each year by December 31st and issue 630,000 assessment notices to Nova Scotia property owners each January. For the 2023 assessment year, the Municipality of the County of Inverness has \$1.898 Billion worth of assessed value; 87% is residential and 13% is commercial. Provincial legislation places a "cap" on eligible property which limits taxable value increases. The cap rate is based on the Nova Scotia Consumer Price Index (CPI), set by Statistics Canada. Nova Scotia residents are entitled to appeal their annual assessment by February 9th, 2023 should they disagree with their valuation.

5. <u>PRESENTATION: GULF AQUARIUM AND MARINE STATION COOPERATIVE; Kiersty Malay and Gretchen Noyes-Hull</u>

The Gulf Aquarium and Marine Station Cooperative (GAMS) was incorporated in 2007 to create a Marine Centre for the Western Coast of Cape Breton. GAMS operates both a marine research station lab and a seasonal interpretive facility in Grand Étang Harbour. The Marine Interpretive Centre is open to the public seasonally, staffed by summer students and volunteers, and supported by visitor donations. Last summer GAMS welcomed 2000 visitors to the Marine Centre. The facility offers summer camps that offer outdoor immersive experiences in the marine environment for ages 4-15. GAMS' total project costs for Summer Outreach and Summer Camp programs is \$5480. Part of the cost is for the purchase of a new touch tank. The current request for funding of the Municipality is \$2740.
