5. PRESENTATION: RAISING THE VILLAGES; Jim Mustard

The Early Years Cooperative strives to raise awareness and understanding of why the early years is the #1 upstream investment for our life-long health (physical and mental), learning, and relationships. Their objectives are to provide the networking, connecting, communicating, and advocacy for regional services, programs, and policies that provide universal access and integration from the pre-natal period onwards. Through the use of data and evidence (EDI) they hope to strengthen community-based decision making, advocacy, and inform supportive upstream policy direction.

6. PRESENTATION: INVERNESS COUNTY HOUSING SURVEY; Maura Beaton

The 2022 Inverness Housing Survey was conducted to gain insight into current housing needs by collecting data about the Inverness County housing market. This data has been collected and analyzed and will be used to inform housing decision-making for future public and private housing developments. The 2022 Inverness County Housing Survey included demographic-focused questions, general questions, and six streams for respondents who represent the following groups: caregivers, residents of Inverness County, non-residents of Inverness County, people who prefer to rent, people who prefer to own and those looking for senior housing. The 2022 Inverness County Housing Survey results have been shared with the Government of Nova Scotia to inform the province-wide housing needs assessment work currently underway. They will develop municipal housing profiles for each of Nova Scotia's 49 municipalities.
