# 1. CALL TO ORDER

Warden MacIsaac called the meeting to order at 9:30 am and welcomed all in attendance. Roll call was taken. Warden MacIsaac acknowledged that the land on which we gather is located in the ancestral and unceded territory of the Mi'kmaq people.

#### 3. STAFF REPORTS

(a) Chestley Carr, Director of Public Works

In preparation for a paving project expected to be awarded in the Spring of 2023, infrastructure staff have been checking the manholes and sewer lines along Route 19 in Mabou. One water valve needs to be realigned. The Municipality will continue to collaborate with provincial Department of Public Works staff until the completion of the paving project. Municipal lighting bulbs and fixtures in Mabou and Port Hood are replaced as required. Staff participated in Confined Space Rescue training on May 2nd & 3rd at the Strathlorne facility. Speed radar signs in Margaree Forks and East Margaree continue to track rates of speed. The CCTV work and flushing of the municipal sewer mains at the Port Hastings rotary was completed on April 21st, 2023, no significant issues were identified by staff. The former Whycocomagh water treatment plant digester is currently being used as a holding tank for sludge/waste greatly reducing the need to truck off-site. Staff assisted other departments with water and wastewater sample delivery to Sydney, water utility connects and disconnects, and traffic control.

Preliminary work has begun to install the new booster skid in Port Hastings; the approach is to complete as much work as possible before replacing the unit minimizing the amount of down time. Lynk Electric have visited the site as well to scope their work. Inspection on the aeration system at the Inverness wastewater treatment plant was started, this is part of preventative maintenance conducted each year to identify any deficiencies in equipment that may reduce the operational efficiency.

Sampling to ensure the Municipality meets its approvals to operate have been completed with no exceedances to report. All operations manuals for the water and wastewater facilities have been updated.

Multiple projects are in various stages of completion including Chéticamp Lift Station Control Panel maintenance, and filter additions at the Inverness Water Treatment Plant. Quotes received for the Strathlorne land clearing project are being reviewed.

## (b) Erin Gillis, Operations and Occupational Health and Safety

The Spring 2023 heavy garbage tender has been awarded to two local contractors. Collections will be during the week of May 29<sup>th</sup> with pickup occurring on the regular garbage pick up day. Staff have been coordinating clean up events and has been working with community leaders to ensure each group has appropriate collection materials and transportation of waste to Kenloch. Staff are preparing for seasonal increases in waste volumes at the Kenloch Waste Management Facility and the Strathlorne Recycling Facility. The By-Law officer is attending the Atlantic By-Law Officers Association conference. This will be the first conference for ABOA since COVID. Regional and provincial meetings for solid waste education continue. Three community clean ups have removed 2410 kg of waste from our communities. Four more are clean ups are scheduled. The Occupational Health and Safety student's eight week internship has finished, with a focus on risk assessments and chemical control. Department staff participated in the Senior Age Well Initiative with the Department of Recreation on May 17<sup>th</sup> in Chéticamp.

Multiple projects are at various stages of completion including the C&D cell development, storage building construction and community bin placement process. The Joint Occupational Health and Safety Committee continues to meet monthly. Meetings are held with regional and provincial waste educators to discuss sold waste management initiatives.

#### (c) Jason Calder, Recreation

Multiple initiatives are underway in Recreation including the Age Well Academy, Nova Scotia Walk Day, Senior Council membership, interviewing for summer student positions, Canada Day Activities planning, Port Hood and Inverness Ball Hockey and the development of a Seniors Safety Program Network with County Residents and Seniors Clubs. The Wellness and Accessibility Committees continue to meet regularly.

The Municipality has received sensory loan items. Currently there are 4 sensory boxes created and ready to loan out. Staff are developing a communication for our website and Facebook to increase awareness. Boxes include puzzles, wooden fidgets, aqua paints, and memory cards, all available to rent free of charge.

Multiple in person and remote meetings were held with various groups and partners including the Municipal Arenas for ball hockey, Inverness Sports Court Facility, Positive Aging, Community Links, the PAPE conference in Dartmouth, as well as internal staff meetings to discuss communications and long term planning.

## (d) Melanie Beaton, Special Projects

A large amount of work continues to be advanced by the Special Projects Team. Some of the larger scale ongoing projects include the Sanitary Sewer & Water Main Replacement Project (Strathlorne/Inverness), Sanitary Sewer and Watermain Replacement Detailed Design, Central Avenue Inverness, Mapping of Existing Municipal Water/Sewer Assets, Port Hastings Rotary Municipal Service Re-alignment and Replacement, Port Hood Lift Station # 1, Whycocomagh Wastewater Treatment Plant and Collection System and Chéticamp Wastewater Treatment Plant System Assessment Report, Whycocomagh and Chéticamp Collection System Flow Monitoring, Inverness and Judique Wastewater Treatment Plant & Outfall. Multiple community projects are at various stages including the Port Hood Park Stage and enhancement, Mi-Carême Brand and signage, the Inverness Multi Court Outdoor Recreation Facility, the Gypsum Mine Trail, Margaree signage, Whycocomagh Façade, Mabou Marina enhancements, Inverness County Public Transportation Review, Clean Energy Financing, Water Conservation, Food Security, Port Hood Development Plan, Trails Review, Electric Vehicle Charging Stations, Meat Cove and Pleasant Bay Branding and Signage, Healthcare Attraction and Retention, Destination 252, and advancing the Housing Survey findings. Municipal staff are in the process of creating a water and wastewater asset mapping exercise for the Mabou and Whycocomagh distribution and collection systems. Meetings continue with consultants, stakeholders, external partners, and community groups.

#### 4. PRESENTATION: Airbnb REGULATION; Chisholm MacKinnon

Chisholm MacKinnon is a resident of Mann Avenue, Inverness and has been retired for the last 10 years. He is concerned that the sense of community is being lost in the area he lives in due to the large number of Airbnb, or short term rentals by homeowners. He describes the impact of Airbnb rentals as three fold:

- I. Close proximity; cars and people coming and going
- II. Impact on housing stock; especially for young families; becoming a "summer town"

#### III. Impact on rental housing.

Some Municipalities in Nova Scotia, and across Canada are legislating restrictions on Airbnb rentals. Mr. MacKinnon is asking Municipal Council to consider amending the Inverness Land Use By-Law regarding policies and regulations for short term rentals in residential areas, or only allowing short term rentals in a primary residence.

Direction to staff to collect the numbers of Airbnb rentals in the County, and to look at what other Municipalities are doing regarding legislating short term rental properties.

## 5. PRESENTATION: AGE WELL ACADEMY; Jason Calder

The Age Well Academy is an initiative to bring seniors together to learn about topics that are of interest to them, to socialize and to enjoy a meal together. Thirteen sessions are scheduled across the Municipality, with at least two in each district from mid-May until November. Speakers and topics include: Continuing Care Nova Scotia, Caregivers Nova Scotia, RCMP, Alzheimer's Society of Nova Scotia, Sort-it-out Waste Services, Water Operations, Recreation and Community Wellness initiatives, and Food Insecurity and Social Isolation.

#### 6. NOVA SCOTIA DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS; J CLASS ROADS COST SHARE AGREEMENT
