Blue bag 1—Paper

Boxboard (cereal and tissue boxes)

Corrugated cardboard (flattened and bundled)

Egg cartons

File folders

Flyers

Books (remove hard covers)

Magazines, catalogues, newspapers

Used printer/writing paper

Toilet paper and paper towel tubes

Paper carry out trays (must be clean and dry)

Phone books

Shredded paper

Paper must be clean and dry.

Blue bag 2—Plastics & containers

Aluminum pie plates and trays

Bags (bread, grocery, shopping, freezer, etc.)

Cans (aluminum, steel, tin)

Drink containers and tetrapaks

Glass bottles and jars
Laundry detergent jugs

Milk containers and bags

Plastic cookie and cake trays

Plastic veggie and fruit trays

Plastic containers and packaging

Shampoo and conditioner bottles

Yogurt and pudding cups

Curbside rules

Limit of 4 garbage bags per week, and no limit for recycling.
Bag maximum is 30" by 37" and 20 lbs. Set bags curbside by 7a.m.

Make sure everything is rinsed out!



Garbage

Bathroom waste and personal hygiene products

Broken glass (please box and label for safety)

Candy wrappers, chip and cookie bags

Coffee/tea pods (Keurig, etc.)

Clothes and textiles (please consider donating)

Dirty diapers

Giftwrap, gift bags, ribbons, bows

Kitty litter, bagged pet waste

Laundry detergent boxes

Meat and cooked food waste

Toys and household items (please consider donating)

Styrofoam

Tooth, hair and lint brushes

Used tinfoil, stretch wrap and plastic wrap

Waxed paper

For needles and syringes, please visit your local pharmacy for a sharps medical container.

Not available for curbside collection

Although not appropriate for curbside pick up, the following items can be dropped off at one of two municipal collecting facilities for proper disposal.

Kenloch Waste Management Facility:

Construction & demolition waste (no creosote materials, treated wood must be separated)

Paints & stains

Motor oil, filters, and empty aerosol cans

Strathlorne Municipal Recycling Facility:

Electronics, batteries, and light bulbs
