### What sort of noise and disruption can we expect?

As with any major construction project, there will be noise, dust, and vibrations during active work hours. The contractor will follow provincial noise regulations and workdays/ hours will be communicated once a schedule is formalized. Residents will be notified of any particularly disruptive activities in advance whenever possible.

### What will traffic look like? Will there be any detours or re-routing?

Traffic will be reduced to one lane in active construction zones. Traffic control personnel and clear signage will be used to guide vehicles and pedestrians safely. We will provide advance notice to affected residents and businesses. Emergency services will always have access.

### Where will contractors start first?

Phase One extends from the intersection of Broad Cove Banks Road to James Street. Work will begin between Broad Cove Banks Road and the trail crossing section.

### What will the construction hours look like?

Construction is anticipated to run Monday to Friday, 8:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. Hours are subject to change. Updates will be shared as appropriate.

### The initial announcement also referenced upgrades to Veterans Memorial Court. Where does that portion of the project stand?

Veterans Memorial Court infrastructure upgrades are in the planning stages. More information will be shared when available however, it is not expected to occur until after the Central Avenue Rebuild project is completed.

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### What will happen to the potted plants on streetlights during this project?

All potted plants and decorative items on streetlights and streetlights will be removed within the phased construction area prior to construction

### Who can I call due to significant water run off on my property?

### Who can I speak with about power lines on my property?

Any questions or concerns related to power lines should be directed to Nova Scotia Power by calling 1-800-428-6230.

### Will my driveway be blocked during this project?

Access to driveways will be maintained as much as possible. Temporary closures may occur when work is taking place directly in front of a property. In those cases, the contractor will provide advance notice and work with residents and businesses to minimize inconvenience and restore access quickly.

### Will I be liable if an employee is injured while on my property?

No. Contractors are required to carry liability insurance and follow all Occupational Health and Safety regulations. Property owners will not be held liable for injuries sustained by workers performing authorized work under the construction contract.
